Guest Presenter: Shelbie Loomis, presenting on the Restore Oregon Event

Shelbie Loomis has lived at the Jantzen Beach RV Park since 2018. She has an MFA in Contemporary Art from Portland State University and is the Founder of Park Arts Artists-in-Residence on Hayden Island.

Restore Oregon was founded in 1977. It is a state-wide 501(c)(3) non-profit supported by members and donors and led by a volunteer board. The program is staffed by professionals that help people save and revitalize historic places and spaces.

At the end of the 30-minute presentation Ms. Loomis answered questions from the audience.

The Jantzen Beach carousel was built in 1921 and moved to the Jantzen Beach Amusement Park in 1928 as a big attraction. The carousel is a C.W. Parker model machine measuring 67 feet in diameter. The Jantzen Beach Amusement Park was demolished in 1970. When the shopping mall opened on Jantzen Beach in 1971 the carousel was added to the ground floor of the shopping center and it remained there until 1995 when the mall was redeveloped. The carousel's future was once again threatened. Mall employees fought to keep the carousel. Community members and politicians spent \$500,000 to restore the carousel. It was then placed into the pavilion at the Food Court at the Jantzen Beach Center. The carousel remained operational in the Jantzen Beach Food Court until 2012.

When the Jantzen Beach Center closed in 2012 the carousel was again placed in storage. Restore Oregon placed the carousel on the Most Endangered Places List. The carousel was donated to Restore Oregon in 2017. On February 2020 Restore Oregon announced a partnership with the Portland Diamond Project (PDP] to restore the carousel to the people of Portland. The project is funded by the Oregon Cultural Trust and the Kinsman Foundation.

In November 2016, an agreement was signed with the Port of Portland's Terminal 2 property as the future home for a major league stadium. The restored carousel will find a new home near the new major league baseball stadium.

For Board Consideration this evening [11/10/2022]:

Motion: HINooN requests a delay in the advancement of the Modified Locally Preferred Alternative into the National Environmental Policy Act process for the purpose of a public discussion of a third Columbia River crossing discussed by a panel of independent bridge and tunnel expert consultants.

The reason:

The Memorandum of Intent signed by the Governors formed an IBR program office, later named the <u>Joint Committee on the Interstate 5 Bridge</u>.

The key initial steps identified for the program office were:

- * Reengage key stakeholders and the public
- * Reevaluate Purpose and Need

After discussions, it was decided that the vote will be taken by email.
